The **EAST Sailing Academy** introduces children and teens to small boat sailing and racing. Young sailors learn in three groups: **Mariners**, **Voyagers** and **Explorers**. The program is taught aboard a fleet of over twenty vessels ranging in size from 13 - 24 feet.



The fleet of 24' Rainbows provides an opportunity for all sailors to get out on the water when the winds would be too high for the small boat fleet. On Rainbow sailing days each boat has an instructor aboard and our young sailors quickly master handling the craft on their own.

The fleet of 15' Cape Cod Mercury's provides perfect learning vessels that allows our young sailors to learn the basics of sailing on a safe, fun boat.



The fleet of 420's provides an opportunity for more experienced sailors to experience sailing and racing on a fast, responsive boat.

INSTRUCTION

Our teaching philosophy at the *EAST* Sailing Academy is "*Patience, not pressure.*" While many children seek to climb the ladder of ability rapidly, others are happier with a more relaxed pace of advancement. Instructors make sure that sailing fun is the first priority of every child.

The student to instructor ratio of the sailing school is a maximum of six students per instructor. Groups are formed by age and sailing experience. *EAST Sailing Academy* students are aged 9-15, and students can begin to sail at any age.

Each group is assigned its own instructor(s) to provide consistency and personal attention.

Top Gun Program: Each week the best sailors are selected from each group to participate in spirited regattas (racing) aboard the East Sailing Academy's fleet of 420's.

Youth Program Fleet: Primary instruction is provided aboard 420's, 15' Cape Cod Mercury's, and 24' Rainbows. The *EAST* Sailing Academy is

LADDER STANDARDS

Participants in the youth program climb a sailing ladder of ability divided into five ranks. Participants are encouraged to practice and master the abilities of the next level, but the student's own pace is respected. Each student is given their personal log book in which to record their progress. The standards of the various levels are as follows:

Second Mate: Knows the parts of the boat and can perform crew duties in the rigging and de-rigging procedures. Second Mates can assist in sailing a set course containing all points of sail. Full knowledge of boating safety is required of all Second Mates.

First Mate: First Mates must sail a set course with crew assistance and direct the rigging and de-rigging of the boat.

Skipper: Skippers prove single-handed ability to rig the boat and sail a set course. Skippers must also pass the *American Sailing Association's* Basic Sailing exam.

Racer: Racers are able to fly a spinnaker and can pass a test on *U.S. Yacht Racing Rules and Regulations*.

Salty Dog: Demonstrates skills of seamanship including marlin spike, navigation and heavy weather sailing.

Awards

Each week the instructors present two awards: the **Neptune Award** for overall sailing ability, and the **Golden Rudder** for progress during the week, to individual sailors in each group. The **Top Gun Award** is given to the winner of the weekly sailing regatta.

Safety: Program participants are required to wear a Personal Flotation Device (PFD) at all times while on the docks or onboard the boats. Students

may wear their own PFD's or one will be provided for them.

Instructors are trained in sailing safety and safe sailing practices are stressed at all times.

RATES AND SCHEDULES

The *EAST* Sailing Academy will offer two one-week sessions at the beginning of the summer season. The remainder of the season is divided into five two-week sessions. Two-week sessions can not be split. Each session runs Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. with a half-hour for supervised lunch. Students may attend as many sessions as they wish, and sessions need not run sequentially.

Our youth program is designed to allow children and teens to progress at their own pace through five ranks of sailing ability: Second Mate, First Mate, Skipper, Racer and Salty Dog. Boating safety is stressed throughout the program and all students wear life jackets at any time they are on board the boats or on the docks. **"Patience, not pressure"** is our motto at the **EAST Sailing Academy** and our unique program enables children to learn in a relaxed and safe atmosphere while offering unlimited challenges to advance their sailing skills.



The Neptune Award and the Golden Rudder are awarded to two sailors from each group, each week, in recognition of their progress and ability. Every Thursday is Awards and Pizza Day, a particularly fine way to celebrate a great week! Each week young sailors look forward to the day trip, when each group sets sail for a destination to anchor for lunch and return in the afternoon.
